THE FLAG

The Antigua and Barbuda Department of Marine Services and Merchant Shipping (ADOMS) is the Maritime Administration of Antigua and Barbuda that offers a quality Ship and Yacht Registry in a competitive and dynamic industry.

ADOMS embraces a cohesive set of modern, national shipping legislation, which reflect mandatory international shipping regulatory instruments, international norms, and best practices that cover all aspects of safety, security, seafarers' welfare, and the requirements for cleaner oceans and sustainable shipping.

Customer service focused, the registry offers competitive incentives to meet the needs of the ship owners' requirements for efficient and economic ship and yacht operations.

Since its inception in 1986, the ship registry has grown progressively and has attained the position where today it is ranked among the top registries in the world's merchant fleet. Internationally well recognized by prominent industry stakeholders, the principal office is located in St. John's, Antigua, and is supported by two branch offices in Oldenburg and Elsfleth, Germany. Ships and yachts flying the Antigua and Barbuda flag are welcome in all ports around the world and are supported by a worldwide coverage of nautical professionals who perform statutory surveys, inspections, audits and issue mandatory statutory certificates that enable these vessels to trade.

Antigua and Barbuda has signed agreements with Recognized Organizations and Recognized Security Organizations, which are all International Association of Classification Societies (IACS) members, who act for and on behalf of the Administration.

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

A vessel may be registered in the ownership of an individual (who must be a citizen of a CARICOM Member State) or a company. Companies registered under the Antigua and Barbuda International Business Corporation (IBC) Act or registered as an external company under the Antigua and Barbuda Companies Act are eligible. A vessel may also be registered if the owner appoints a Principal Representative in Antigua & Barbuda. There are a number of Corporate Management and Trust Service Providers in Antigua and Barbuda to assist in the formation of a company.

Registration of a vessel under the flag of Antigua and Barbuda can be completed in two easy steps:

Step 1

Submit an application for vessel registration along with proof of ownership (an invoice for new vessels or a bill of sale for vessels in service), Proof of Company Incorporation or Appointment of a Principal Representative, and a Deletion Certificate/Closed Transcript from the previous registry. Other documents may be required depending on the size and intended use of the vessel.

Step 2

Payment of requisite fees. Fees are determined based on the size and intended use of the vessel.

Registration can be completed in less than seventy-two (72) hours subject to the adequacy of the documents submitted.
